German - American Day (Deutsch - Amerikanisher Tag)

This holiday is mainly observed by German-Americans. This day commemorates the date in 1683, when 13 German families from Krefeld landed in Philadelphia and founded Germantown, PA. In 1983, President Reagan proclaimed October 6 as German - American Day to celebrate and Honor the 300th anniversary of German American immigration.

This year we are celebrating German American Day on Sunday, October 8th. We will celebrate at St. John UCC, on Third Street. During the service, at 10:30 we will sing three German songs. After the service, a dinner will be served. The Liederkranz-Turner will be providing the Sauerbraten with Ginger gravy and we are asking members to bring side dishes.
